With a capacity of more than 4,1 GW in operation or under construction, Neoen is a high-growth company. Neoen is notably active in Argentina, Australia, El Salvador, Finland, France, Ireland, Jamaica, Mexico, Mozambique, Portugal and Zambia. In particular, Neoen operates France's most powerful solar farm (300 MWp) in Cestas, and the world's first big battery (150 MW / 193,5 MWh storage capacity) in Hornsdale, Australia.

In Ireland, Neoen owns a 54MW portfolio of eight commissioned wind farms and is also at varying stages of development of a growing number of greenfield wind farms. In the solar sector, Neoen and its Irish partner BNRG have been declared in 2020 successful for around 55 MWp in the Republic of Ireland's first governmental tender for solar farms.

Neoen is seeking applications for the role of Business Development Manager, to be based in our Dublin office. This is a broad-ranging and dynamic role, and the successful applicant will be responsible for the coordination and management of new and current onshore wind projects in Ireland.

Role Purpose & Key Responsibilities

Reporting to the Wind Business Development Manager, you will be part of Neoen's growing development team tasked with progressing our greenfield and repowering portfolio of wind projects in Ireland. The role will entail working alongside the Wind Business Development Manager to offer support and the coordination of multi-disciplinary teams from our external panel of providers of planning, environmental services, electrical and wind analysis.

The main tasks include:

- Managing the Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) and planning process of specific wind power projects from initial stages through to handover to our pre-construction team.
- Oversight of third-party partners and providers of technical services.
- Developing plans to assist with landowner negotiations (on site, road access, cable, and overhead line wayleaves, etc.)
- Supporting the development of a business case in the acquisition of wind energy projects.
- External stakeholder management including local communities, local authorities, and elected representatives.
- Support the submission of offers in the case of public or private tenders
- Support the Construction and Asset management teams during the initial phases of the performance of the services.
- Familiarity with and ensuring compliance with Health & Safety procedures.
- Regular management reporting.

- Master's degree in engineering, planning or business administration, with specialisation in renewable energy, environment, or project management – experience in wind farm projects development is considered an advantage.
- 3-5 years work experience in a similar role.
- Proficiency in the use of GIS/AutoCad software is considered an advantage.

- Strong motivation to work in a complex environment; you are organized, open-minded and able to work independently; you can work on several projects in parallel.
